Region. Many remembered our same fundraiser in the past and were happy to support us again.

How it works: A flower bulb company out of Wisconsin with growers in Holland and the United States, assigns us our own website <u>http://SIGV.fpfundraising.com</u>), and when we let them know which Program (Spring, Fall, Holiday) we wish to participate in, they activate the site.

There are no out-of-pocket costs, plus free order forms, as well as customer support if needed, we send our customers to the site to order as many bulbs/plants/seeds as desired. The client pays directly to FP Fundraising (plus a shipping fee of \$6.99) and orders are shipped out from FP Fundraising to the client. With a 100% grow guarantee! We are paid 50% of every sale!

For advertising the Fall Program, I put together a series of photos taken from the company's catalog, posted it to Facebook, and added a written description of either how I would use the flowers in my garden, or as a gift, a memory, etc. I included the website for ordering and added a description of who we support on every post. I also asked my friends to share the posts.
