The fair committee is ready for the fair and we need you! We have a great committee again this year. Tina Skrukrud as Chair, Marlene Sharon as Co-chair. The four project team members on the committee are Tessa Marmorstein, Kim Jones, Kristin Plante and Shauna Vance. And again they all have great ideas! We are updated the day chair instructions with info from our wrap-up meeting after the last fair. Tessa updated the slide show for the booth. Kristin made new hang tags for the booth that have all the "extras" on them and Sign-up Genius Schedule with QR code. Shauna worked on the closing instructions and what the cashier needs to do. Kim has worked on the day chair instruction and signage. Tina does all the ordering and Marlene and committee will clean and label. One of the changes we have made is serving only Teriyaki Chicken this year. We also are going to use all compostable bowls and forks. And from a happy mistake, we are going to use 12 oz bowls, the same amount of food, but this size makes the bowls look fuller. We are asking everyone to wear closed-toe shoes for health and safety reasons.

I am so excited to get to work with these great women! I have worked in the fair booth since 2007 before I was a member. By 2008 I was the co-chair and believe I became the Chair in 2010. This is the largest Fundraiser for SIGV! With the funds from the Fair booth, we can give out grants and scholarships which we just awarded this May at Outstanding Effort and Celebration of Service events. My favorite reason to run the Fair Booth is giving a scholarship to a single mom overcoming a hard ship then they finish college and continue to succeed. One year at the Fair, a recipient bought a teriyaki bowl and told us that the money we gave her helped her finish school and she was hired as an RN at Sutter Health. Another was working at the fair as an EMT and with our help now works for Cal Fire. Another recipient won at our club level and then District & Regional levels and became an RN with no student loans. She is now married and owns 2 homes of her own.




